Difference between Cool and Bad

(Infinitives) object of a verb

- An infinitive is a verbal consisting of to + a verb, and it acts like a subject, direct object, subject complement, adjective, or adverb in a sentence. It functions differently from verbs and it acts as a noun, adjective, or adverb.
- A noun can be a person, place, or thing. When used as a subject or direct object in a sentence, an infinitive phrase acts as a noun. The subject assumes the role of a verb, whereas the direct object is the receiver of the action of a verb.

Example

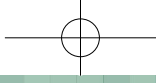
Do you **swear to tell** the whole truth?
