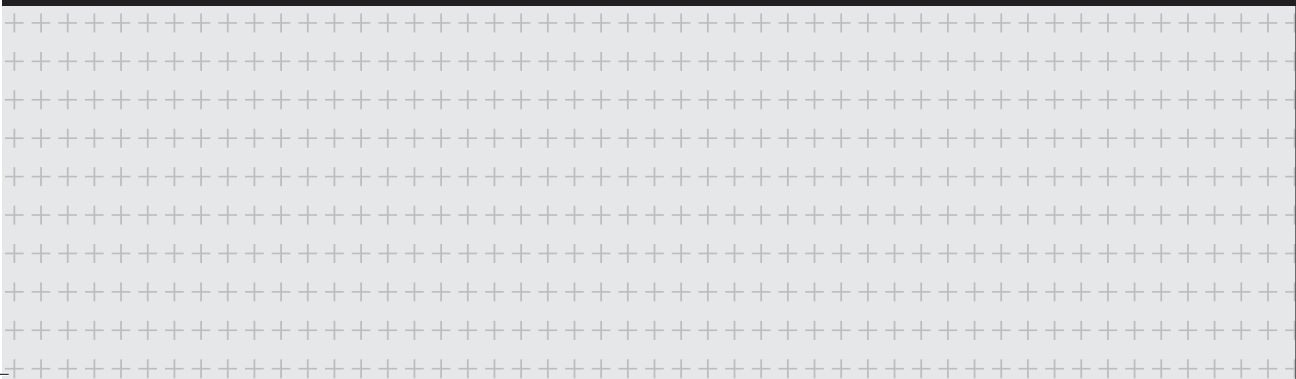


Unit [01] Catching Santa



(Present) I do

- We use present simple tense to refer to general truths or habits.

Example

- The sun rises in the east.
- It fades in the west.
- I go to school on weekdays.
- He drives to school.
- Their house is far from school.

Soon, he heard sleigh bells coming closer and the pitter-patter of reindeer feet on the roof. He listened to Santa Claus **coming down** the chimney. Then, ★**he** turned on his flashlight and shouted, “Ha! **I see** you!”

Santa Claus was so surprised. “Oh! What are you doing up, Carlos? You know you’re supposed to be asleep!” Carlos was also so stunned that he dropped his flashlight and hid in the closet under the stairs. “I’m sorry I was bad!” Carlos

whimpered. Carlos could hear Santa filling the stockings with something. He was sure it was lump of coal for naughty children. Then, he heard him going up the chimney. (c) ■ Carlos regretted it, but it was too late.

Mama and Papa ran downstairs next morning, and Dan, Brody, and Andrew followed them. “Where is Carlos?” asked Papa. No one could find him. “Look at this!” Andrew shouted, pointing to a note taped to Carlos’s stocking. It read: “I met Carlos last night, and we both were quite frightened. You’ll find him beneath the stairs.” Dan opened the closet door, and found Carlos. “Santa Claus filled my stocking with coal, didn’t he?” Carlos’ eyes were filled with tears. “Come and see for yourself,” Mother smiled. Carlos was delighted to find his stocking full of gifts just like the other boys’. Then Carlos found another note at the bottom of his stocking. (d) ■ It read: “Santa Claus is very shy, but ★he will never pass you by.” Carlos smiled. “I will never try to catch Santa again,” he said.

▪ follow [v]	to move behind someone or something and go where he, she, or it goes I shouldn't follow her nonsense rules.

▪ beneath [prep]	in or to a lower position than someone or something, under someone or something Dad, there is a monster beneath my bed.
▪ catch [v]	to find and stop a person or animal that is trying to escape I'm still trying to catch the boy who stole my wallet yesterday.
