| elderly (adj) | advanced in years [They never offer their seat to an elderly person.] |
| unexpected (adj) | not expected or anticipated [My heart jumped at the unexpected news.] |
| personal (adj) | belonging to one particular person |
| neglect (v) | to give too little or no attention to something [Do not neglect others' good advice.] |
| expand (v) | to extend in one or more directions [He was trying to expand his business.] |
| incidence (n) | something usually unpleasant happens |
| amend (v) | to add to or to change (a proposal or law) [He had to amend his opinion.] |
| reconstruct (v) | to rebuild something that has been destroyed [The government must reconstruct the shattered economy.] |

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| frozen (adj) | turned into ice; affected by freezing [Ice and snow are just frozen water.] |
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| exhausted (adj) | extremely tired or completely tired [He was so exhausted that he fell asleep at his desk.] |
| abroad (adv) | in another country or countries; overseas |
| compulsory (adj) | that must be done by rules or regulation |
| even (adj) | staying at about the same level [How important is it to have an even temperature when you're working?] |
| excel (v) | to be very good at doing something [As a child in England, Firth did not excel in school.] |
| oxygen (n) | a gas that is necessary for most animals and plants on earth [Oxygen is essential to human life.] |
| lunar (adj) | connected with the moons |
