01 (Future) I will (not)

- One of the main uses of *will* is to refer to things in the future that we think are certain.
- The negative form of *will* is *won't*. We use the full form *will not* in formal contexts.

Example

What will you do next weekend?

I **will** visit my grandparent's house.

I **will not** go there with my brother.

I **will** meet my grandmother.

I **will** have dinner together with them.
