### (Future) I will (not)

- One of the main uses of will is to refer to things in the future that we think are certain.
- The negative form of will is won't. We use the full form will not in formal contexts.

## **Example**

What will you do next weekend?

I will visit my grandparent's house.

I will not go there with my brother.

I will meet my grandmother.

I will have dinner together with them.
