- 2. Supporting Sentence 1 Ali is twelve years old. She lives next door to me.
- 4. Supporting Sentence 3
  5. Concluding Sentence
  Best of all, she's on my soccer team.
  I think she is the greatest friend I've ever had.

- Supporting Sentence: Write facts or descriptions that relate to the topic.
